Reverse Logistics has been on the scene now for quite a long time. We've always had product returns with a money back request or sending to a repair depot to get something fixed or upgraded. But when did it become a competitive advantage?

Netflix is an early example of building a business model based on reverse logistics. Remember when we had to request a physical DVD in order to watch a movie? Netflix had an envelope for sending the DVD to you that, once opened, became the envelope for the product return. Ingenious. Or was it?

Other companies with larger products have also developed significant reverse logistics components to their supply chain and their business model. Clothing and shoe sellers have endorsed a "buy many – return many" philosophy. How has that been working?

Speaker Bio:

Lisa Cotter is the founder and leader of Nicollet Solutions, which is a return reduction and reverse logistics optimization company. Prior to leading this start up, she spent 17 years at Best Buy leading reverse logistics, demand planning and replenishment, supply chain strategy and network design, and vendor management. Prior to joining Best Buy, Lisa was managing director of logistics at Musicland and worked in distribution and manufacturing at Hewlett Packard.

Lisa holds a Master of Science in industrial engineering from Stanford University, and a Bachelor of Science in industrial engineering from Iowa State University. She is an Adjunct Professor at Carlson School at the University of Minnesota and, in 2019, she was named Executive Leadership Fellow for the Carlson School. She coauthored "Reverse Logistics: What It Is and Where It Is Headed" which was published in The Oxford Handbook of Supply Chain Management in 2020. Lisa was also a Reverse Logistics Association board member from 2016-2019, Vice Chair of the Consumer Technology Wireless Board, and is currently a board member for the Illusion Theater.

Keeping supply chains secure is no easy feat. In an increasingly hyper-connected world, recent software compromises and other incidents have revealed how new and inherent vulnerabilities in supply chains can have globally cascading consequences that can impact our daily lives.

Join us as Noel Kyle talks about Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and the Supply Chain Risk Management (SCRM) Task Force. As the Nation's risk advisor, supply chain security is a top priority for the CISA—a priority it achieves largely through the Information Communications Technology (ICT) SCRM Task Force. With over 70 industry representatives, the Task Force is a public-private partnership that embodies the Agency's collective approach to enhancing global supply chain resilience.

Ms. Noel Kyle is the Supply Chain Risk Management Initiative Lead within the National Risk Management Center (NRMC) at the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA). Ms. Kyle oversees a wide-ranging CISA-wide program intended to provide supply chain support and recommendations to partners and stakeholders across the federal government and private industry.

Prior to working with DHS, Ms. Kyle managed programs in business improvement, financial analysis, and marketing at companies of all sizes, ranging from a Fortune 100 firm to small businesses. Ms. Kyle holds a Master of Business Administration from the University of Miami in Florida and a Bachelor of Science in Marketing from Old Dominion University in Florida. She also holds Certified Information Security Manager (CISM) and Project Management Professional (PMP) certifications.



CPIM Certification


Acquire a working knowledge of the tools and techniques for planning of inventory, including planning techniques such as MRP, CRP, lean, TOC, and projects. Understand the effect of using each technique; know standard measurements for inventory, materials, capacity and supplier performance; and recognize when to escalate issues. Topics include:



- Managing inventory, planning material requirements, planning capacity requirements, and procurement and supplier planning
- Recognizing the importance of supply chain management and deploying supply chain strategies related to scheduling, planning, and sourcing
- Translating product-level plans and schedules generated at the master planning level into requirements that can be procured or produced
- Bridging the master planning area with the execution and control function
- Planning, scheduling, resource allocation, and implementing projects that are used to manage the supply of products and services 2017
